HAWS amended policy and procedures presentation-Tom policy committee

A discussion took place regarding the policy and procedures changes.

HAWS policy vote- Toni made a motion Anna C seconded it. It passed with 27 yes for abstaining and one no.

Alateen task force recommendation for AMIAS certification Jane Alateen coordinator : information was given by having members play a jeopardy type game.

A question and answer discussion followed before putting the task force recommendation up for a vote. it was suggested to use Ecourt which is free.

It was also suggested that all 29 current AMIAS also have background checks. Plus there was a concern when getting fingerprinted of keeping anonymity.

Alateen task force vote “ The Hawaii area will require new AMIAS's to get a background check including fingerprinting for a trial period of one year. Details will be worked out by the Alateen task force.
